1. **SB 241** **PA Equal Pay Law Reforms (Amendment #A00217)**
 The bill protects the rights of employees to discuss, disclose or inquire about wages and to make or participate in a claim or an alleged violation of this act. The amendment would have severely inhibited an employer's ability to defend against frivolous or illegitimate claims brought under the Equal Pay Law.

3. **HB 542** **Tax Reform Code (Final Passage)**
 The proposal relied on \$600 million in new and increased energy taxes, including a severance tax on natural gas; a gross receipts tax on natural gas users; and increased gross receipts taxes on electricity and telecommunications users.

4. **SB 936** **Workers' Compensation Reform (Amendment A04462)**
 The bill would implement a prescription drug formulary for the state's workers' compensation system, helping to address prescription drug overuse by injured workers. The amendment included a significant eligibility expansion of a particular benefit and replaced the prescription drug formulary approach outlined in the bill with a Preferred Drug list maintained by the Department of Human Services.

5. **SB 936** **Workers' Compensation Reform (Final Passage)**

6. **SB 977** **Regulatory Reform (Final Passage)**
 The bill would allow various legislative standing committees to intervene in the regulatory development process if warranted. The legislation would provide transparency, accountability and effective oversight to the regulatory rulemaking process.

7. **SB 1056** **Bonus Depreciation (Final Passage Reconsidered)**
 Reverses a December 2017 state Department of Revenue decision that prohibits taxpayers from claiming a full 100 percent bonus depreciation deduction for Pennsylvania tax purposes.

8. **SB 652** **Critical Infrastructure Protections (Final Passage)**
 The bill would enhance criminal penalties for trespassing on critical infrastructure, such as energy transmission assets, wastewater treatment plants, telecommunications arrays and manufacturing facilities.

9. **SB 1172** **Price Controls During Emergency Declarations (Final Passage)**

11. **HB 1419** **Clean Slate (Final Passage)**

12. **HB 2138** **Welfare to Work (Final Passage)**

13. **HB 1840** **Workers' Compensation Protz Fix (Final Passage)**
 The bill addresses a 2017 PA Supreme Court decision which struck the Impairment Rating Evaluation process from the Workers' Compensation Act, costing employers hundreds of millions of dollars.

1. **SB 1** **Pension Reform (Final Passage)**
Establishes a hybrid defined benefit/defined contribution system for new state and public school employees.
Bill Sponsor – Sen. Jake Corman (R-Centre)

2. **HB 18** **Workers' Compensation Reform (Motion to recommit to House Human Services Committee)**
The bill would implement a prescription drug formulary for the state's workers' compensation system. The action to recommit the bill derailed legislation that would have helped address prescription drug overuse by injured workers.
Bill Sponsor – Rep. Ryan Mackenzie (R-Lehigh)
Motion – Rep. Gene DiGirolamo (R-Bucks)

Status – Referred to House Rules Committee
3. **HB 1213** **Spot Assessments (Amendment #A01336)**
Counties are prohibited from picking and choosing individual properties to reassess in order to increase their taxes, but some school districts are getting around this prohibition and hiring contingency-based consultants to appeal larger properties. HB 1213 generally prohibits spot appeals except under certain circumstances and also ensures that assessments cannot be increased beyond what is uniform among comparable properties. Amendment A01336 would restrict the practice of spot appeals brought against homes or farms, but allow the practice to continue unregulated against businesses.

4. **HB 113** **Severance Tax (Discharge Resolution)**
The resolution would have discharged the bill – which places a 3.5 percent severance tax on natural gas on top of the impact fee – from the House Environmental Resources and Energy Committee and moved it to the House floor for possible consideration.

5. **HR 515** **Moratorium on Natural Gas Drilling (Adoption)**
The resolution urges the Delaware River Basin Commission to suspend consideration of a moratorium on natural gas drilling in the Delaware River Basin.

6. **HB 1401** **Severance Tax (Motion to proceed to special order)**
The bill would place a 3.2 percent severance tax on natural gas on top of the current impact fee. The motion to proceed to special order would have forced leadership to relinquish control of the House.

7. **SB 166** **Paycheck Protection (Final Passage)**
