Luke Bernstein, President and CEO, PA Chamber of Business and Industry

A seasoned financial, government, and public policy professional, Luke came to the organization in 2022 with more than 20 years of experience in the public and private sectors.

Before leading the PA Chamber, Luke was most recently executive vice president, chief operations and technology officer at Orrstown Financial Services. He had served as Orrstown's corporate spokesperson since 2017.

He was previously senior vice president of external affairs at the Pennsylvania Bankers
Association from 2015 to 2017 and deputy chief of staff for former Pennsylvania Gov. Tom Corbett from 2011 to 2015.

In addition to his executive leadership roles in the private sector and state government, Luke has experience working at the federal level, as a former appointed advisor in the Administration of President George W. Luke also completed the Duke Leadership Program at Duke University's Fuqua School of Business. He is a very active member of his community, serving on numerous boards and as a youth sports coach.

Anzur most recently served as chief of staff and campaign manager to Congressman Fred Keller (PA-12). Anzur also previously worked as a top aide to former Congressman Lou Barletta, managing Barletta's U.S. House re-election and U.S. Senate campaigns and serving as communications director in his Washington, D.C. office. Dr. Val Arkoosh, Secretary, Pennsylvania Department of Human Services

Valerie A. Arkoosh, MD, MPH, was appointed to lead the Pennsylvania Department of Human Services by Governor Josh Shapiro on January 17, 2023.

Prior to this role, Secretary Arkoosh served on the Montgomery County Board of Commissioners for eight years, serving as Commission Chair from November 2016 through January 2023. As a physician and public health professional, Secretary Arkoosh was at the center of Montgomery County's efforts to combat the COVID-19 pandemic, leading a data- and science-driven approach to the unprecedented challenge. Arkoosh's leadership was praised during

the county's response, especially her transparency and public communication throughout the pandemic.

Arkoosh is a graduate of the University of Nebraska College of Medicine and received a Master of Public Health from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. She performed her residency at Jefferson Medical College in Anesthesiology with a special focus in Obstetrics. Prior to stepping into public service, Secretary Arkoosh was Professor of Clinical Anesthesiology and Clinical Obstetrics and Gynecology at the Perelman School of Medicine of the University of Pennsylvania.

Upon obtaining her Master of Public Health in 2007, Arkoosh became deeply engaged in the national effort to achieve comprehensive health care reform. She led the National Physicians Alliance, a national non-profit organization of physicians, who, putting their patients before profits, joined a broad-based nation-wide coalition for reform. During this time, she developed policy and legislative strategy, and promoted public engagement in Washington, D.C., Pennsylvania, and throughout the country. Dr. Arkoosh maintains comprehensive knowledge of the implementation of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act and its impact on individuals and the health care system.

Kevin Stevens, Former NHL All-Star and Olympian

Kevin Stevens graduated from Silver Lake Regional High School in Kingston, MA where he captained the hockey, football and baseball teams. Kevin was invited to try out for both the Toronto Blue Jays and the Philadelphia Phillies. He admitted he "couldn't hit the curve ball", so he decided to pursue hockey.

Kevin received a full hockey scholarship to Boston College where he was a two-time All American and captain of the BC Eagles team. In 1983, he was drafted by the Los Angeles Kings, and his rights would be traded to the Pittsburgh Penguins shortly thereafter. With big dreams of making it to the NHL, Kevin smartly elected to finish his degree at BC in the event he "may have to get a real job". Kevin graduated from BC in 1987.

From there Kevin represented the U.S. National Hockey Team at the 1987 World Championships and was a member of the 1988 US Hockey Team at the Winter Olympics in Calgary, Canada.

He then went on to play for the Pittsburgh Penguins where he became one of the top left wingers and power forwards in the National Hockey League.

In Game 3 of the Prince of Wales Conference final versus Boston Bruins, May 21, 1993, Kevin became only the 25th player in NHL history to score 3 goals in a single period. He had a hat trick in the first period and would go on to score another goal before the end of the game. Penguins swept the Bruins in that series and subsequently swept the Chicago Blackhawks to win their 2nd straight Stanley Cup.

One year later, on May 14th, 1993, the Penguins were playing the NY Islanders in game 7 of the Patrick Division Finals. Early in the first period, Kevin skated hard and checked Islanders defenseman Rich Pilon, but hit Pilon's visor with so much force that it knocked Kevin unconscious. Kevin landed face first on the ice; having been knocked out, he was unable to soften the blow when he landed. Kevin shattered most of the bones in his face and required extensive reconstructive surgery. Doctors cut an incision below his hairline from ear to ear, which was later closed with over 140 stitches, peeled back his skin and reassembled the bones in Kevin's face with the use of 9 metal plates.

She came to the Health System in June 1997 with 13 years of health care related litigation experience. Prior to working at Penn, she was a shareholder in the Philadelphia law firm of Christie, Pabarue, Mortensen and Young, P.C. where her practice focused on medical malpractice, health care benefits, and other health care related litigation.

Ms. Nepps is a member of the Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, and American Bar Associations. She served as chair of the 5,000 member Young Lawyers Section of the Philadelphia Bar Association in 1992 and was a member of the Association's Board of Governors. She also served as a member of the Pennsylvania Bar Association's House of Delegates and previously chaired the Association's Health Care Law Committee. She also has served as a member of the American Bar Association House of Delegates. In addition, Ms. Nepps was a founding member of the board of directors for the Legal Clinic for the Disabled, Inc. She has lectured on medical/legal liability related topics both at the University and the Health System as well as at various national organization meetings and has authored/co-authored publications on various health care, insurance, and risk management related topics.

Ms. Nepps is a graduate of St. Joseph's University (B.A., summa cum laude, 1981) and the Cornell Law School (J.D., 1984). She is admitted to practice in Pennsylvania and New Jersey.

Robin Snyder, Director, Health Care Department, Marshall Dennehey

Robin is the Director of the Health Care Department at Marshall Dennehey, and is responsible for the day-to-day operations and supervision of the firm's health care attorneys. She is also a member of the firm's Board of Directors. From 2003 – 2017, Robin served as the Managing Attorney of the firm's Moosic office. Robin is an elected associate member of the American Board of Trial Advocates (ABOTA), a national association of experienced trial lawyers and judges that works to enhance the civil trial jury system. She is admitted to the U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Pennsylvania and the Eastern District of Pennsylvania, as well as the Third Circuit Court of Appeals.

Curt Schroder — Moderator, Executive Director, Pennsylvania Coalition for Civil Justice Reform

Curt Schroder is a Philadelphia-area attorney who spent his early years witnessing first-hand how there can be abusive and unfair litigation in the court system.

During his seventeen years in the Pennsylvania House of Representatives, Schroder worked to restore fairness to Pennsylvania's courts. A tireless advocate of medical malpractice reform, many of the changes to the legal system championed by Schroder resulted in stemming the flow of doctors leaving the state and allowed hospitals to resume providing lifesaving services.

Schroder was also an outspoken leader in working towards passage of the hallmark Fair Share Act.

This act ensures that a party in a lawsuit does not have to pay out more than that for which they are legally responsible.

Before taking the helm at the Pennsylvania Coalition for Civil Justice Reform (PCCJR), Schroder was a regional executive of a health care association and lobbied on behalf of health care clients for a Harrisburg based firm.

Now as the PCCJR Executive Director, Schroder is a statewide advocate and leader dedicating his years of experience and legal expertise to restoring common sense to our courts and personal responsibility to society. In doing so, Schroder is using that experience to protect family sustaining jobs and health care from extinction due to excessive and abusive litigation. Schroder is committed to a Pennsylvania that has fair laws, fair courts, and a true balance in our legal system.
